Awards/Scholarships/Bursaries

- **Scholarships** are awarded for academic achievement.
- **Awards** are given to students based on financial need, school or community involvement and academic achievement.
- **Bursaries** are awarded to students who demonstrate financial need.



SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Academic Achievement

- Averages of grade 11 marks, current marks, self-reported final marks, or final marks.

School and Community Leadership/Volunteerism

- School Opportunities (Yearbook, Student Leadership, Book Club, Peer Assisting, Canteen.)
- School sports teams
- Community clubs, coaching, assisting, ref, manage any sport, soccer, skating, hockey, baseball, etc.
- Church- sing in a choir, organist, server, work in kitchen at fall suppers, concerts, teach Sunday School, Church Camp
- 4H programs
- Special Olympics, visiting seniors, guides, brownies, scouts, etc.



Post-Secondary Admissions

- Each institution has unique requirements
- Each program has unique requirements
- Often it is math and sciences that cause issues!

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University of Manitoba General Entrance Scholarships

- Entrance scholarships are automatically awarded to students graduating from a Canadian high school with outstanding academic averages.
- A submission through Apply Yourself by the **scholarships deadline of March 1, 2026.**
- A **minimum average of 85%** over the best **five courses** from a pre-approved list.

Level I	average greater than or equal to 95%	\$3,000
Level II	average greater than or equal to 90%	\$2,000
Level III	average greater than or equal to 85%	\$1,000

Scholarships

To be eligible for entrance scholarships, students must demonstrate a minimum 85% average over five 40S courses in different subject areas*. For example:

- Applied Math or Pre-Calculus Math
- Biology
- Chemistry
- Computer Science
- English (Anglais) or French (Français)
- Any one other language
- Family Studies or Foods & Nutrition
- Geography
- Any History
- Any Indigenous Studies
- Any Music
- Physics
- Visual Arts
- World Issues or Global Issues

*With the exception of English (two English courses may be used), students must demonstrate excellence in five different subject areas.

Only courses highlighted in blue (page 2-3) determine which courses can be used for scholarship consideration.

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University of Manitoba Bursaries

Awards for students currently in classes at U of M

Fall/Winter University of Manitoba General Bursary

- Annual application and supporting documentation to be submitted to the Financial Aid & Awards Office by: **October 1st.**
- Available in early-to-mid August through the Aurora Student portal.
- Continuing University of Manitoba students must meet a G.P.A. requirement of a minimum cumulative G.P.A. of 2.0.

Spring/Summer University of Manitoba General Bursary

- Annual application available early April. Application due **May 1st.**





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BMO Leader of Tomorrow & Indigenous Leader of Tomorrow Entrance Scholarships

- The Leader of Tomorrow Scholarship program highlights exceptional high school graduates who combine outstanding leadership potential with academic giftedness. Each scholarship is valued at \$16 000, allocated over four years of study
- Students must have completed a University of Manitoba application for admission by the **December 1** deadline, including payment of application fee.
- Applicants must submit a Leader of Tomorrow Scholarship application to the Financial Aid and Awards Office by the posted deadline **December 1**.

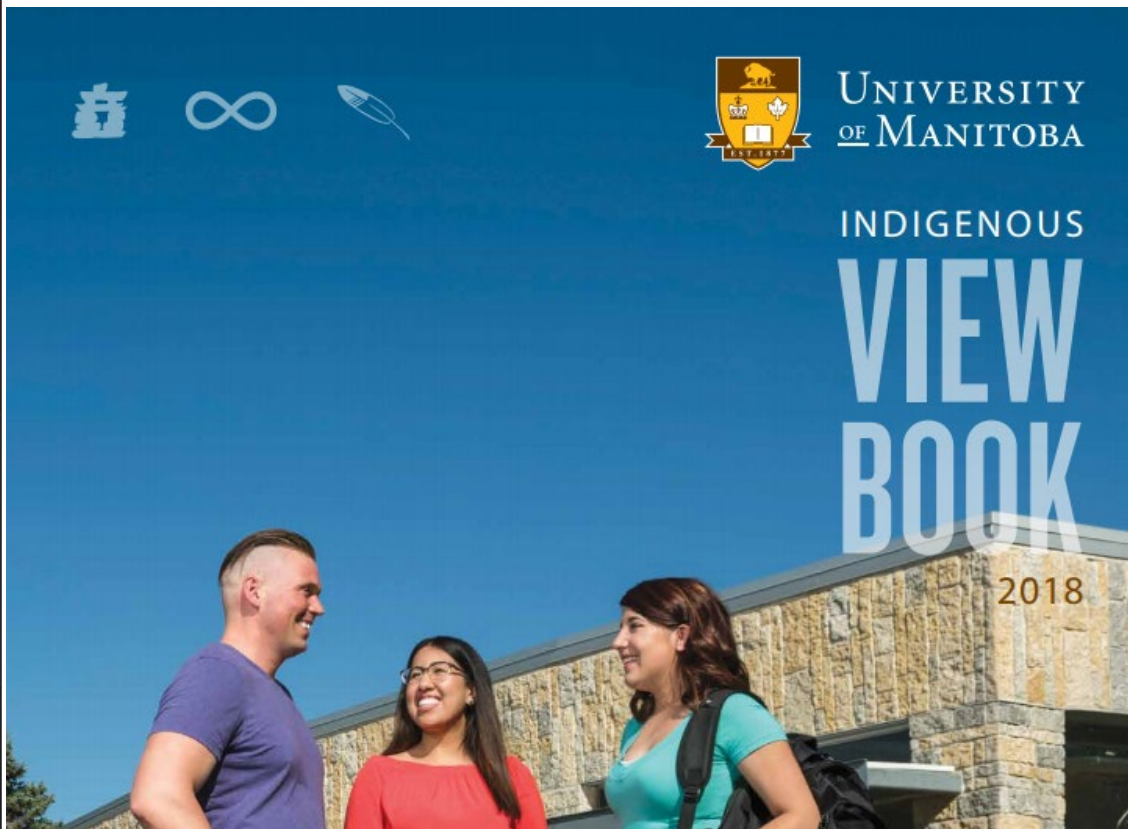

- No need to apply to both a Direct Entry faculty AND University 1 – U1 offered automatically to DE faculty applicants who are not selected
- Encourage your students to use an email address they check regularly – they should use their own personal email addresses
- Admission decisions for DE faculties are typically made in May and are based on first semester finals, and second semester interim grades

Application tips and reminders



- Direct Entry applicants must meet both the general and program specific admission requirements.
 - General: 5 x courses at 40 S, G, U or C level
 - Program-specific: 4 x academic 40S courses with minimum average
 - Some competitive programs may require higher than minimum averages
 - Use the admission requirements chart and 40S academic course guide to ensure students are taking the correct classes for admission to their intended programs
 - REMINDER: Not all grade 12 courses are considered for admission and scholarships
- Application fee of \$100 CDN (\$130 CDN for international) must be received by the application deadline for the application to be considered submitted

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Uof W Estimated Costs

Tuition and Fees

uwinnipeg.ca/tuition

Exact tuition fees are determined by the number of courses taken and the faculty that offers them. Five courses per term, or 30 credit hours per academic year, is the maximum course load. Full-time status requires a minimum of three courses per term (18 credit hours per academic year).

Estimated Tuition and Fees for One Academic Year (September-April)

5 Courses Per Term (maximum course load)

Tuition—5 Courses (30 credit hours in any faculty)	\$4,490-\$5,150
General Fees, Books, and Supplies	\$2,300-\$2,500
UWSA Health Insurance	\$500
U-Pass (Unlimited transit access)	\$450
Total	\$7,740-\$8,600





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U of W Entrance Scholarships (Automatic Scholarships)

- Apply to the University of Winnipeg by **March 1, 2026** to be **automatically** reviewed for entrance scholarships.
- For all students (Arts, Business and Economics, Education, Kinesiology, and Science), the scholarship average is calculated based on the following:
 - Best 40S English (Comprehensive Focus, Literary Focus or Transactional Focus), and
 - Best 40S Math* (Pre-Calculus, Applied Math or Essential Math), and
 - One other 40S or higher level full credit course.





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U of W Application Required Entrance Awards

- Apply to the University of Winnipeg by **March 1, 2026** for some of their application required entrance awards.
- Application-Required Entrance Scholarships are for all students who are "new" to the University of Winnipeg and have not taken credits or completed a degree before.

Applied for Entrance Awards	Variety of criteria such as community involvement, leadership experience, etc.	Varies	Submit your application and log in to the awards portal to apply by March 1
IB Entrance Scholarship	International Baccalaureate Diploma with 30+ points, with no grades below four	\$2,250	Automatic consideration
AP Program Entrance Scholarship	Achieve the Advanced Placement Scholar with Distinction	\$2,250	Automatic consideration
AP Transfer Credit Scholarship	Admitted directly from high school and transfer exam results toward undergraduate studies	\$250 for each AP exam result of 5 \$150 for each AP exam result of 4	Submit a Request to Transfer Credit form before October 31 of first year

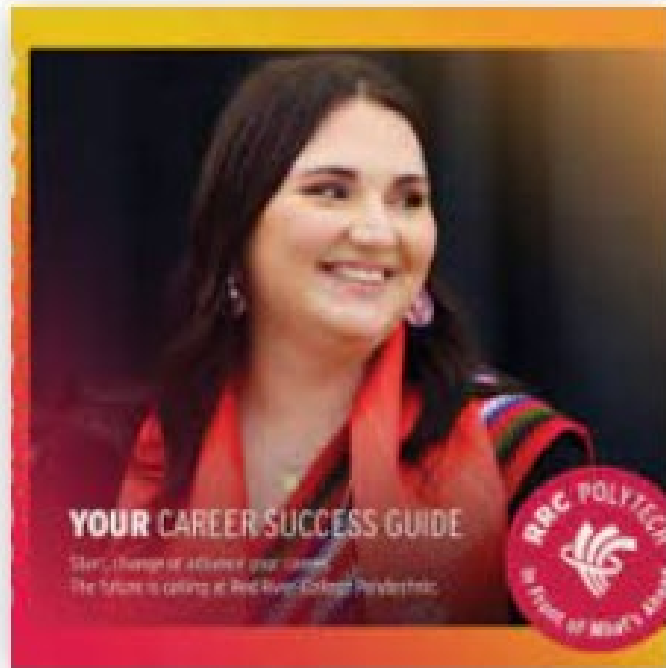

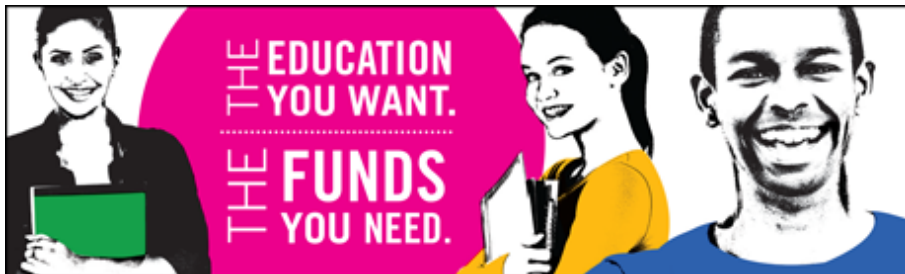

- Manitoba Student Aid | Province of Manitoba (gov.mb.ca)
 - One application to the Manitoba Student Aid program will have you registered for federal student loans as well. (Application typically available in June)
 - Apply as early as possible before classes start but students can also apply after their term has started.
 - Not just loans! Large number of non-repayable grants and bursaries.
 - No interest/no payments while studying full-time
